Get **free** help finding health coverage after a qualifying life change

You may qualify for special enrollment—an opportunity to renew, review, or explore new health coverage outside of open enrollment—if, in the past 60 days, you or anyone in your household:

- Lost qualifying health coverage
- Got married, divorced, or legally separated
- Had a baby, adopted a child, or placed a child for foster care
- Moved to a new ZIP code, county, or to the U.S. from a foreign country or United States territory
